



## THE GRAPEVINE: LYETH CABERNET SAUVIGNON

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I've been meaning to write about this wine for quite a while now, and I was reminded of my intent to do so after I recently fell into another glass of this delicious Cabernet Sauvignon.

I first stumbled across the Lyeth (pronounced "Leeth") Cabernet Sauvignon a couple of months ago over dinner at J. Alexanders. I had ordered the strip steak, which in turn prompted me to abide by the rules and pair it up with a nice red wine. This Cab stood out as a product of Sonoma County, so I decided to give it a taste.

And, I am very happy that I did.

It drank slightly chilled and incredibly smooth, and paired very well with my steak. As the tasting notes detail, I could definitely identify the plum, blackberry, and cedar aromas, and the layers of wild berry and black currant were most notable to me at first sip.

This was easily one of the best wines I had had in a long time, and I became very eager to learn more.

After a bit of research, I learned that the Lyeth Cabernet Sauvignon is actually found under their "L de Lyeth" label. More importantly, I was pleasantly surprised to learn that the retail price per bottle ranges around \$13.00 dollars!

I had originally pegged this to be \$25-\$35 bottle of wine, so rest assured I will be stocking up on this one!

Simply put, this is a solid, well built Cab that I strongly recommend you give some attention.
