



## Balmy eyes ideal for viewing outdoor flicks

**Weekend market at DeLoach Vineyards:** DeLoach Vineyards (1791 Olivet Road, Santa Rosa) is currently offering produce from its 18,000- square-foot organic garden for sale on Saturdays and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Cyndicy Coudray, hospitality and culinary director for the winery, suggests arriving as early in the day as possible, when the produce is still bright and perky. When it heats up, the harvest is moved inside the tasting room where it is cooler, but still, it's best to get things in the morning and have them in the fridge before the heat of the day.

Last week, the market featured eggs, strawberries, artichokes, several varieties of onions, garlic, cucumbers, summer squash, zucchini, purple mustard, chard, a selection of lettuces, radicchio, purple-top turnips and the season's first tomatoes. Heirloom tomatoes and haricots verts should ripen any time now.

Prices are reasonable, ranging from \$1 for three garlic bulbs to \$2 a head for lettuces and radicchio. The market will continue through October.
